THE HOLY TRINITY CHURCH AT PENN

The Holy Trinity Church is located in the Village of Penn, Buckinghamshire, UK. This beautiful atmospheric church, rich in history, dates back to at least the 12th century. The 398th BG has a connection with Holy Trinity as this is where a lectern holding The Book of Remembrance listing the names of the Charles J. Searl crew is on display for public viewing. The inscription begins; ***“In Honoured And Grateful Memory Of A Gallant American Bomber Crew”... “Their Flying Fortress caught fire over Penn and avoiding dwellings they crashed in flames between Parsonage Farm and Lude Farm”... “In thus saving others, themselves they could not save”.*** Their doomed B-17 was the “Tomahawk Warrior”. The men of this crew were; Charles J. Searl, Pilot; Albert J. Dion, Co-Pilot; Saul J. Kempner, Navigator; Leo C. Walsh, Bombardier; Cecil E. Kennedy, Radio; James A. Beaty, Engineer; Alfred Bueffel, Ball Turret; Albert W. Knight, Waist Gunner; Orville M. Wilson, Tail Gunner. Each Armistice Day Penn Church remembers them in the service and reads their names out along with others who gave their lives from the village.

The story on the next page *“B-17 Tomahawk Warrior”* by Ronald M. Setter, is a tribute to the Searl Crew who tragically perished upon crashing in the open fields of Penn, England on August 12, 1944.

B-17 “Tomahawk Warrior”, A Tribute to the Charles J. Searl Crew

Saturday, 12 August 1944 – a B-17 bomber named the *Tomahawk Warrior* and nine young men came into the history of Penn forever. Many years have gone by – some of the elders of Penn who remembered that day have passed away and a new generation born. They can only read of the sacrifice made by the *Tomahawk Warrior* and her crew.

The nine young men who flew that morning died long before their time on their 25th mission. Only a few more to fly and they would have been going home to loved ones and a full and happy life ahead.

This is their story.....

The 398th Bomb Group was one of the last to arrive in this country during March 1944. They flew their B-17's from Newfoundland to England to the allotted aerodrome of Nuthampstead near Royston in Herts where the countryside was very similar to that which surrounds Penn. To one crew their B-17 was special to them and as was usual the Pilot, Charles Searl, named it the *Tomahawk Warrior* after the small town where he lived. There was a crew of ten to fly her and a skilled ground crew to care for her. The first mission was to Berlin on the 19th of May. They returned safely and one can only feel that they were relieved and jubilant.

Charles Searl was married with a daughter of 18 months and he and his wife were expecting another addition to the family in July. He was 23 and had enlisted in the Air Force soon after Pearl Harbor. As far as records show, none of the other nine crewmembers were married and their ages ranged from 20 to 27. They had come from many states across the USA... Wisconsin, Massachusetts, Michigan, Washington, D.C., Arkansas, Virginia, Ohio and New York.

The *Tomahawk Warrior* flew many missions including a D-Day one to targets at Caen and Courseulles, France. Missions were interposed with leave which one supposes they spent in London. Their evenings would be spent at the local Inn just on the edge of the airfield and at Royston, the nearest small town. Entertainment would have been laid on at the base along with dances and there must have been invitations from the local population.

By June the *Tomahawk Warrior* had completed sixteen missions, all with the same crew. July recorded only five missions. During this month Charles Searl must have received news of the birth of a second daughter, sadly he was never to see.

From August 1st, the *Tomahawk Warrior*, still with her original crew, flew missions to France and Germany and on the morning of the 12th were on their twenty-fifth to Europe, Versailles, France. The day was dull and overcast with low cloud. Just before take-off, the tenth member of the crew stepped down from the flight. It has never been sure why. All that is known of him is his name and rank and after the *Tomahawk Warrior* crashed he was returned to America and so survived the war. No trace of him was ever found.

The crew of nine took off at 0618. Formation was hazardous with the bad weather as the plane climbed to reach height. By 0700 the *Tomahawk Warrior* was heading out Southeast and already in trouble.

One engine was seen to be on fire, and as it turned over the town of High Wycombe to return to base, a second engine was seen also on fire. Below in the town was the HQ of the 8th Air Force and most likely monitoring the mission. It has always been accepted that the pilot was trying to find open ground to attempt a landing when he had no chance of reaching his base or even Bovingdon airfield which was only ten miles away to the North. He would have seen the populated area he was flying over and realized the devastation the plane would cause if it crashed there. It skimmed over the farmhouse of Lude Farm and crashed into open fields opposite. *Tomahawk Warrior* and its crew of nine young men ended life in a massive explosion and fire. No one had bailed out of the stricken plane and no distress signal was ever traced. They stayed together, comrades now for all eternity. One of the crew was found in the lane and two at the edge of the fields. The rest were identified by their dog tags. A short entry in official records at their base read, 'Takeoff 0618 hours, 0720 no return'. Such a short epitaph.

No investigation took place as to the reason for the crash. It was just one more casualty of war. General Doolittle, who was at the HQ in High Wycombe, visited the scene of the crash later in the day.

The field where the *Tomahawk Warrior* crashed is the same today as it was fifty-seven years ago. Beautiful, peaceful and the seasons come and go. It is an everlasting memorial to duty and sacrifice. They that died need no other.



They were all buried in Cambridge Cemetery but after the war, in accordance with the wishes of their relatives, eight of them were re-interred in Arlington Cemetery, America. They sleep amongst the highly honored in America. The one who was left behind, Albert Knight, also with his parent's wishes, is honored yearly by the Chiltern Aircraft Research Group on the anniversary of the crash with flowers and thoughts of the eight lying in their home country.

Each Armistice Day, Penn Church remembers them in the service and reads their names out along with others who gave their lives from the village. Small American Flags are placed along the path by the church door, each with the name of the *Tomahawk Warrior's* crew, and usually the Battle Hymn of the Republic is sung in honor. The Book of Remembrance in Penn Church has their names inscribed in glorious memory.

To all who read this tribute, remember... they gave their lives just as bravely and in sacrifice for peace, just as those who were lost on and over the battlefields of Europe.

Terence Robert St. Louis, Ball Turret Gunner, 601st SQ

A Life Well Lived

Terence, almost certainly the last surviving Air Force historian who served throughout World War II joined those from the greatest generation who preceded him in death on September 27th, 2013. Terry enlisted shortly after graduating from high school in upstate New York. His first assignment was in the Canal Zone as part of the lend lease or Destroyers for Bases swap with the United Kingdom at the beginning of World War II in which American Destroyers were sent to England in exchange for long term leases of British holdings. His second assignment also under the destroyer swap wasn't too unpleasant either as he was stationed on the British West Indies island of Trinidad, a place he often recounted as one of the most beautiful in the world. Eventually Terry won a transfer to the Army Air Corp and began pilot training in April of 1944 at Sheppard Field, Texas. Terry, along with 36,000 other young pilots, was reassigned shortly after the Japanese surrender and in July of 1944, thanks to his compact stature he entered gunnery school in Kingman Arizona before moving on to B-17 flight training and finally being assigned to the 601st Bomb Squad 398th Bomb Group stationed in Nuthampstead, England as a ball turret gunner. On 25 April 1945 Terry flew his final of 24 combat missions with the Eighth Air Force, as part of a bombing raid on the Skoda armament works at Pilsen, Czechoslovakia as part of the liberation of Czechoslovakia.

Terry met his future wife, Lydia Noyes of Poquonock Bridge, Connecticut in 1946 when his brother Bud and his family were stationed at the submarine base in New London. While Lydia was only 14 at the time the Noyes families and the St. Louis families formed a close bond. Although Terry left Connecticut to pursue college in Syracuse in New York and to travel some he returned in 1948 to reenlist in New London to serve as part of the Berlin Air Lift and in he and Lydia were married in 1951.

Following the war, he was briefly a public affairs officer before becoming an enlisted historian. Terry retired from active military service in 1963 but would continue his profession as an historian for twenty years as a civil servant. During the course of his career Terry finished a Bachelor's degree in History from the University of Maryland and a Masters in International Relations from the University of Arkansas while serving at Headquarters Eurcom in Wiesbaden, Germany. Terry's final assignment was as the historian for the Air Force Operational Test and Evaluation Center at Kirtland Air Force Base, Albuquerque, New Mexico in 1975 until his retirement in 1986.

Terry remained active with many organizations in his retirement, the one that meant the most to him was the 8th Air Force 398th Bomb Group Memorial Association. A particular highlight of his retirement was in summer 2008 when Terry and his wife Lydia, traveled to Pilsen, Czechoslovakia on a tour sponsored by the Eighth Air Force Historical Society. The visiting Americans were hosted as dignitaries by Czech civil and military officials who even flew Terry and others over what had long ago been their target. Terry was the lone survivor from the original mission and when asked what he thought of seeing the targets he commented "it was the first time I've actually seen them there was too much smoke and flack that day."

Terry was a consummate story teller and believed the telling of our history to be one of our most important tasks. He was often heard quoting Winston Churchill, "those who fail to learn from history are doomed to repeat it." Terry was one who lived history, taught history and with his life left a great legacy for those who follow.

A VERY RARE FIND INDEED!

To the right is a photo of the 601st Squadron plaque which was recovered from a building in London, England undergoing refurbishment during the late 1980's.

This rare plaque was just recently donated to the Nuthampstead Airfield Museum by Neal Cawley who found it all those years ago. He explained; *"25 years ago I was a mobile sandblaster... and in a building in London, stuck on a pillar in the basement was a metal hand painted plaque with the emblem of the 601 Bomb Squadron, with title 398 Bomb Group. I don't know if the building was a dance hall or base for the squadron. I would love to find the painter and wonder if he is still alive."*

The Nuthampstead Airfield Museum and the 398th BGMA are eager to find out more about this plaque, especially which building it was found in. Our donor tells us he cannot remember what part of London he was working in back then but he does remember the building had a very wide staircase down to a lower area where he found the plaque attached to a large column.

We are guessing this building might have been a Red Cross Club or possibly the London Stage Door Canteen.
