Statement Concerning Missing Aircraft B17G 43-38670, Pilot, 1st Lt Robert G Campbell, O-818346, 601st Bomb Squadron, 398th Bomb Group Bv on Operational Mission to Herschburg, Germany 1944. 2 November 1944,

Lt Campbell's aircraft was flying in the high squadron in front of the one I was in (low). Shortly after our first right turn off the target I saw an airplane push out of the formation and start down. It dropped some distance before going into a left hand spin. I am quite sure that three crew members cleared the plane before it started to spin. The plane spun into the clouds below and out of my sight.

About four or five minutes after the target we saw a Fortress from our group going down rapidly but apparently under control. The plane crossed over from our left and disappeared from our view in the nose position still not in a dive. I saw no chutes open. We were unable to ascertain what the trouble was, whether hit by flak or fighters.

Statement Concerning Missing Aircraft B17G 43-38670, Pilot, 1st Lt Robert G Campbell, 0-818346, 601st Bomb Squadron, 398th Bomb Group Bv on Operational Mission to Merseburg, Germany 2 November 1944.

Approximately four minutes after Bombs Away over the target, a few seconds before fighters hit us, I noticed a fire in back of the number two engine, inside of the wing in Lt Campbell's ship. We were flying number three position in low element with Campbell as our element leader. The fire inside his wing resembled a blast furnace. About thirty seconds after I noticed the fire Campbell dove the ship at a very sharp angle straight ahead under good control, evidently in an effort to put the flames out. We followed for about five hundred feet believing it was evasive action. On noticing the lead ship flying straight and level we pulled up and Lt Campbell continued on down. Our tail gunner, S/Sgt Brenger reported seeing three chutes. Lt Morrison flying number two on Campbell, followed Campbell about a thousand feet below us before pulling up.



After receiving word over the interphone that Lt Campbell, our Element Lead, was hit by flak. I noticed his ship dropping down to my left. I saw it only for about a second. About a minute after this I saw two chutes about a mile apart which were opening to the right of our ship and down just above the clouds. I presumed that they probably came from Lt Campbell's ship due to the short time that elapsed from the time I saw him go by until I had observed the chuting men.

Statement Concerning Missing Aircraft B17G 43-38670. Pilot, 1st Lt Robert G Campbell, O-818345, 601st Bomb Squadron, 398th Bomb Group Rv on Combat Mission to Merseburg, Germany 2 November 1944.

I was flying Ball Turret on Lt T. W. Johnson's crew on 2 November 1944. About two or three minutes after Bombs Away I heard over the interphone that a plane was on fire behind us. I turned around and saw it at 7:00 o'clock. The number two engine was all ablaze, I think the tank was on fire also. My bombardier called me and told me to see how many chutes came out. I saw six chutes come out at a level about two thousand feet below us. One chute opened just above the clouds.

Just after this I heard our tail gunner, Sgt Lescalle, report that there was some fighter activity in the squadron behind. About a minute after this as we were in a shallow left turn, my bombardier, Lt N. A. Robinson reported that a plane was in a flat spin just to the left of us. I watched it until it went into the clouds but could see no chutes.

About a minute later the bombardier called up and reported a plane burning in a dive from what could have been our high group. The crew in the nose and cockpit saw it explode once -- then dive on further than explode again and disappeared a mass of flames into the clouds. I followed it down a considerable distance myself and saw no one leave the plane.



(This contains sheets of 16 pages) Date of the mission was 2 Nov. 1944, the target was the synthetic oil plants at Merseberg, Germany. Our target time was 1307 and we got the bombs away right on the minute. About a minute later we got a direct hit in the bomb bay. We had been under fighter attacks since passing the I. P. We jumped at 29,000 ft. All survived except the pilot. We were taken prisoner soon after landing. I was kept in a hospital for 3 weeks in Leipzig because of a fractured pelvis bone and bruised hips. I received almost no medical attention. Some X-rays were taken. I was transferred through Dulag to Luft 4 and later evacuated to Luft 1. I was literated by the Red Army on May 2, 1945.




