Intelligence Reports state that Bombs were away at 1153⁴ and that enemy fighters attacked planes of the 518th Bomb Group B at 1150. Members of the High Squadron believe that their attacks came at approximately 1200.

After about 10 seconds the formation was seen to leave the formation in a diving turn to the right with possibly an enemy fighter on his tail shortly after enemy fighters first hit this formation. There was some evidence of fire.





At the time of the fighters attacked we were above in the high element. We did evasive action, in the course of which I saw Lehner's ship "F" for Freddie peel out of the formation to the right. I didn't see him after that. In the glance I got of him I'm sure I saw an enemy fighter pressing another attack on him.

Statement Concerning Missing Aircraft B17G 43-38671, Pilot, 1st Lt Robert W Lehner, C-756264, 603rd Bomb Squadron, 398th Bomb Group RV on Combat Mission to Merseburg, Germany 21 November 1944.

After fighters hit the formation busted up--the lead crew bailed out and the lead ship peeled out of formation and went down as number one engine was feathered and number two windmilling. I heard over the interphone at same time that "F" Freddie peeled out and down to right with A FW on his tail. We dived into the cirrus bank and contrails below. As we did I saw a plane cut in front of us and below and to the left also drop down into the clouds, flying on a parallel course. After being in the clouds for about a minute or so I noticed the ship had pulled out and off to the left of us still flying on a somewhat parallel course. At this time that we went into the clouds bank this ship appeared to be under control and OK. I saw no more of him after I noticed him the second time at a distance. I have reason to believe it was Howell because there were just the three ships of the lead element in front of us and the other two ships had been seen to dive out of the formation previously.






